about the Star Wars Universe. Stop in October 11 from 4:30-6:00. No sign up is required to attend.

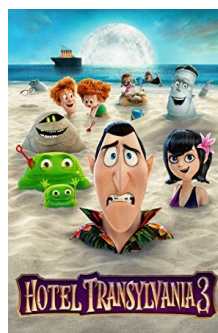


Hotel Transylvania 3

Popcorn and soda will be served.

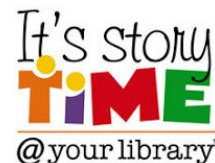


Spooktacular Program

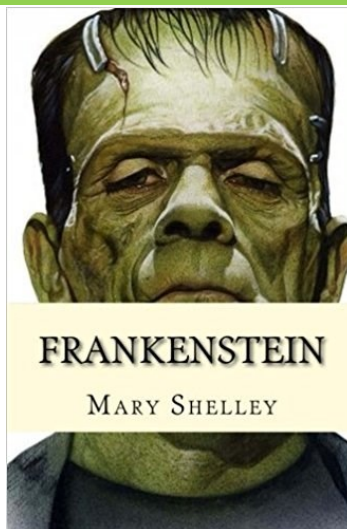
Storytime is Wednesdays at 11:00.

Novel Points Book of the Month: *Frankenstein*

Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus, is a novel written by English author Mary Shelley about the young student of science Victor Frankenstein, who creates a grotesque but sentient creature in an unorthodox scientific experiment. Shelley started writing the story when she was eighteen, and the novel was published when she was twenty. The first edition was published anonymously in London in 1818. Shelley's name appears on the second edition, published in France in 1823. Shelley had travelled through Europe in 1814, journeying along the river Rhine in Germany with a stop in Gernsheim which is just 17 km (10 mi) away from Frankenstein Castle, where two centuries before an alchemist was engaged in experiments. Join us for book discussion and dessert on October 29 at 5:30. Books can be checked out at the adult circulation desk. This book
