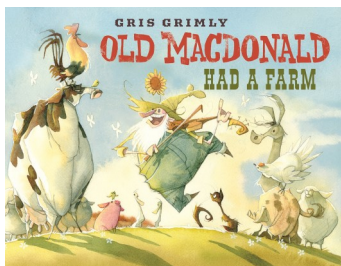
Merry Lea-Birds-(June 21)

Free Eiteljorg Museum Passes



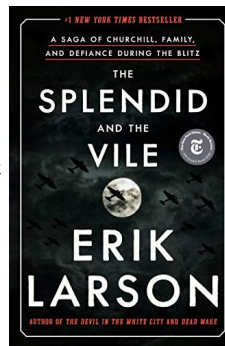
Eiteljorg passes are now available for check out from the Ligonier Public Library again! Using your library
