
## Black Pine Animal Sanctuary: One Story/One State



The Ligonier Public Library is on the loose again! Join us

**August 20th at 10 a.m.** to attend a tour of the Black Pine Animal Sanctuary. Tickets are free but you must sign up in person at the library as we have limited space. Please sign up by August 18 to participate. Ligonier Public Library has been awarded a Community Read grant of \$750 from Indiana Humanities to participate in a statewide read of Aimee Nezhukumatathil's *World of Wonders: In Praise of Fireflies, Whale Sharks, and Other Astonishments*. This will be the third program in this series. Books are available for free while supplies last to read and pass on. *One State / One Story: World of Wonders* is an initiative designed by Indiana Humanities, in partnership with the Indiana State Library and Indiana Center for the Book, to encourage Hoosiers to read and engage deeply with a book as part of a statewide conversation tied to Indiana Humanities' current theme. *Driving to Black Pine is on your own.*

## Novel Points Book Discussion: *Born a Crime*



*Trevor Noah's unlikely path from apartheid South Africa to the desk of The Daily Show began with a criminal act: his birth. Trevor was born to a white Swiss father and a black Xhosa mother at a time when such a union was punishable by five years in prison. Living proof of his parents' indiscretion, Trevor was kept mostly indoors for the earliest years of his life, bound by the extreme and often absurd measures his mother took to hide him from a government that could, at any moment, steal him away.*

*Finally liberated by the end of South Africa's tyrannical white rule, Trevor and his mother set forth on a grand adventure, living openly and freely and embracing the opportunities won by a centuries-long struggle.* Pick up a copy at the adult desk. 
