August 11 at 2:00, celebrate the end of summer and the beginning of the school year with a family movie day and popcorn.




#### Ligonier Storywalk: Can You Do This?

## Novel Points Discussion Group: My Mother's Secret

Join us for August's book of the month: *My Mother's Secret* by J.L. Witterick. We will be meeting on August 25 at 5:00. Franciszka and her daughter, Helena, are simple, ordinary people...until 1939, when the Nazis invade their homeland. Providing shelter to Jews in Na-



zi-occupied Poland is a death sentence, but Franciszka and Helena do exactly that. In their tiny home in Sokal, they hide a Jewish family in a loft above their pigsty, a Jewish doctor with his wife and son in a makeshift cellar under the kitchen, and a defecting German soldier in the attic—each party completely unknown to the others. For everyone to survive, Franciszka will have to outsmart her neighbors and the German commander.
