Ligonier Public Library Goes Fine Free!

What better way to celebrate National Library Card Sign Up Month than with the Ligonier Public Library going Fine Free! The Ligonier Public Library (LPL) announced it is doing away with overdue fines for all LPL cardholders. Approved by the Library's Board of Trustees at its August 12, 2025 meeting, LPL will erase most overdue fines from the accounts of its patrons effective September 1, 2025. In addition, cardholders will no longer accumulate fines for most overdue materials. A few items

such hotspots, museum passes, and Library of Things items will still accrue a small fine. Does this mean that no one has to ever bring anything back? No! Those cardholders will continue to be

responsible for fees related to lost or damaged library materials or fines owed to other libraries. It also voted to retroactively forgive fines for LPL items that

became overdue prior to September I, 2025. Why are we doing this? Eliminating fines ensures that all people have free access to library materials and resources, encouraging the pursuit of life-long learning. Ligonier Public

Library is one of three individual library systems in Noble County and has been serving the town of the Ligonier for nearly 117 years with expanding to serve Perry Township. We are proud to bring this change to our community for a better library experience!



September 16 at 5:00



Novel Points Book of the Month: The Year of Magical Thinking

Several days before Christmas 2003, John Gregory Dunne and Joan Didion saw their only daughter, Quintana Roo, fall ill with septic shock. She was put into an induced coma and placed on life support. Days later, the Dunnes were sitting down to dinner after visiting their daughter in the hospital when John suffered a fatal heart attack. In that one moment, their partnership of



forty years came to an end.

This powerful narrative is Didion's "attempt to make sense of the weeks and then months that cut loose any fixed idea I ever had about death, about illness... about marriage and children and memory...about the shallowness of sanity, about life itself."

Joan Didion delivers a searing portrait of a marriage and a life – in good times and bad – that will speak to anyone who has ever loved and lost a husband or wife or child. In a work of electric honesty and passion, Didion explores how we all, somehow, will ourselves to survive. "An utterly shattering portrait of loss and grief."
